Warm up Questions:

- What is a news flash?
- In this news flash, who is: (a) the news reader? (Bruce) (b) the news reporter? (Katie Conner)
- What news channel do they work for? (Channel 7 News)
- Which fairy tale do you think this could be part of? Recount the story to your teacher. (The Three Little Pigs)

Main Questions:

- 1. Is this news report inside or outside?
- 2. Of the three pigs, is the Mr Pig being interviewed the first, second or third pig? (first 'house of straw')
- 3. Is his house still standing? (no)
- 4. Has Mr Pig cut himself? (yes he is bleeding)
- 5. Is the cut big or small? (big he's bleeding badly)
- 6. Why do you think Mr Pig has a headache? (something fell on his head when his house was blown down)
- 7. Do you think this is why he can't remember anything? (yes)
- 8. Mr Pig believes a tornado hit his house. Do you think Katie Conner agrees with him? ('Yes' 'it looks as if a tornado has swept right through this area')
- 9. Is the ambulance man at the scene polite? (Yes. 'I'm afraid', 'Sorry madam', 'sir')
- 10. When is this action taking place?(a) a long time in the past? (b) a short time in the past?(c) now as it happens? (now, it's a live broadcast)

Essential Vocabulary:

- When Mr Pig is talking he often uses informal speech.
 - Can you find his informal words in the text and highlight them? (don't; you're; we'll; it's; I'm; I've; he's)
- Now match them with how we would write them formally:
 - (do not; you are; we will; it is; I am; I have; he is)
- Draw a picture of the tornado Katie Conner describes.
- Does Mr Pig have a small headache or a big headache? (big)
- Write down the word that tells you this. (banging)
- How does Katie Conner describe the tornado in paragraph 2, like a mop, like a spade or like a brush? Draw your answer.
- Highlight two words in this paragraph that tell you this. (swept, brushed)

Evaluative Questions:

- What do you think really happened to Mr Pig's house? (the wolf blew it down)
- Why do you think 'old Wolfie boy' wanted to see Mr Pig? (he wanted to eat him)
- Where do you think 'Wolfie' is now? (at the next pig's house)
- Your teacher will now give you a part to act out. Pretend you are one of the characters. As a group think how you would say the words in your parts.
- Do you like this way of re-telling an old story? Why? How does this help you learn?
